## 3. National Standardised Assessments

#### Donald A Macleod and Maeve MacKinnon

Measaidhean Coitcheann Nàiseanta airson Foghlam tron Ghàidhlig (MCNG) have been commissioned by the Scottish Government as part of the National Improvement Framework.

Online assessments have been developed to help identify children's progress in literacy and numeracy, providing diagnostic information to support teachers' professional judgement. All children and young people in Gaelic Medium Education (P1, P4, P7 and S3) will complete MCNG in literacy and numeracy through the medium of Gaelic.

This workshop will provide delegates with an insight into the MCNG: the rationale behind the assessments; the process of developing assessment questions; and an understanding of the diagnostic information generated by the system and how this can contribute to the wider assessment of children and young people.
