Cultar Coinneach Odhar – Fiosaiche**Obair 1**

- In Scotland, in the 15th century.
- A fiosaiche (or prophet) is able to see into the future and make predictions of events. Unlike people with an dà shealladh, they can control their power and use it on demand.
- Coinneach's mother came upon a ghost of a Danish princess in a graveyard. Before she would let the ghost pass back into her grave she asked the ghost for a gift for her son – the ability to see the future.
- Coinneach used a small stone with a hole in it. When he looked through the hole, he could see into the future.

Obair 2 Bàs Choinnich Odhair**Ceistean**

- He was thrown into a spiked barrel of boiling tar.
- Coinneach told Lady Seaforth that her husband was with another woman and that the Seaforth family line would come to an end. She was so angry that she had Coinneach put to death.
- In 1783, Francis Humberston Mackenzie, deaf and dumb from Scarlet Fever as a child, inherited the Seaforth title. He had four children who died prematurely and the family line did indeed come to an end.
